



13th Smooth Operator – New Members Rod and Louise Evenden and Past Members Rob and Justin Mace, Ian Durham



QINGDAO CHINA OPTIMIST TRAINING CAMP AND REGATTA

Two of MYC's junior sailors, Lachie Weber and Will McKenzie, have just returned from competing at the Qingdao International Optimist Training Camp and Regatta in China. They were part of a team of 7 sailors representing VIODA (Victorian International Optimist Dinghy Association), including MMYC locals Zac and Mackenzie Heyes and Holly Shepherd, and they were joined by sailors from Hong Kong, Taiwan and throughout China.

The team have said it was an amazing experience to sail in this Regatta. Not only was this the venue of the sailing for the 2008 Beijing Olympics but they were able to watch some great tacking and downwind techniques by the leading Chinese Opti sailors. The wind for the duration of the Regatta was fairly light, and unfortunately there was not enough wind for racing on the final day. However, it can be said that Lachie and Will both sailed well enough to finish a respectable 19th and 20th respectively in such a quality fleet, and should be very proud of their efforts.

Off the water there were lots activities to be involved with, including 2 opening ceremonies and a closing ceremony. The level of standard for the official productions was very high and included dancing cheerleaders, fireworks, martial arts displays, many official speakers and guest speakers such as Chinese Volvo Round the World and Solo sailors. The highlight however was at the Closing Ceremony whereby the VIODA team stole the show and entertained everyone with a rousing rendition of Home Among the Gumtrees complete with backup video showcasing the sailors, our wonderful Port Phillip Bay and of course the beautiful Mornington Peninsula. Fun times were also had with the Hong Kong team throughout the event and we are looking forward to hopefully catching up with many of them in December at Sail Melbourne.
