Thirty nine boats competed in race 4 of the Red Rejuvenation Twilight Series in a fresh breeze last Thursday. Steve Young was first home in **Necessity** winning the \$50 Red Rejuvenation voucher. **Lucinda** Barry Mills was 2nd with Warren Neate's **Lightfoot** 3rd. The Rocks prize for closest to starting time went to **Jessie** Graeme Pimlott. **Lightfoot** leads the Red Rejuvenation series.

We had 15 starters in the Hobsons Bay Destination Race on Saturday. The wind was fickle early with all boats becalmed for lengthy periods. Javelin and Maximumm had a hard fought battle for line honours in Div.1 with Javelin narrowly triumphing. YT2 and Annabelle took line honours in Divs.2 & 3 respectively. Div. 1 AMS went to Seduction with Javelin 2nd and Windsong completing the podium. Div.2 AMS had YT2 1st from Arabelle & Tonic. Times R Tuff won Div.3 CBH from Mixed Nuts & Annabelle. Seduction YT2 & Mixed Nuts lead their divisions in the Long distance Race Series. The PHC results had Windsong winning from Javelin & Maximumm in Div. 1. Lightfoot won Div.2 from Tonic & YT2. Mixed Nuts was 1st in Div.3 from Times R Tuff and Annabelle.

Hobsons Bay Yacht Club made us very welcome from the moment we arrived. Their volunteers were on hand to serve us cheese & biscuits while we enjoyed a few pre dinner drinks.
