"Dear Trevor, Maggie & fellow Turkeys,

When every aspect of a journey rates at eleven out of ten, it's hard to imagine how a holiday will ever be the same again. Despite being back into my "normal" routine I'm still floating on (Turkish) clouds. The turkey Rally was an adventure from day one. The tempo was easily managed by all ages and fitness levels – take and do as much as you like – organised but with free time to explore and enjoy solitude or company. A remarkable experience.



The Lycian coast of Turkey is best enjoyed from the sea. Sailing on the yachts from bay to bay or relaxing on the crewed gulet with meals and provisioning taken care of. Swimming every day in the warm turquoise waters, exploring ancient sites, shopping

in the bazaars, eating delicious Turkish food or running up a mountain to maintain fitness levels – all a matter of choice.

Not everyone is prepared to sit on the river cruise boats or large cruise liners – the rally experience is for the more adventurous individual looking for a more discerning view of Turkey. With a leisurely passage, ample swim stops on a whim, the company of like-minded people, including the youngest at six years of age and the oldest at seventy something!

For the first time on a Mariner Yacht Rally a traditional Turkish gulet joined the fleet of sailing yachts. Apart from being used by rally managers for race starts and finishes the gulet had thirteen passengers and it became an important social platform for all participants. Experienced sailors from the gulet provided back up crew for rally yachts. Thus the rally was opened up to anyone who fancies a unique social experience while enjoying the very best there is on offer along the Lycian Coast of Turkey between Gocek and Antalya.



And what an offering it is - secluded tree lined bays, contrasting busy seaside villages against the backdrop of the spectacular Atlas Mountains, welcoming friendly people, tasty healthy food, clean sea, timeless history and a switched on support team to ensure that every aspect of the two week rally experience is delivered.

The five races added interest not only to the race crews. The gulet was the cheer-squad platform for the starts and finishes and the yacht crews enjoyed the response.

In Gocek, Kalkan, Kas and Antalya the shops offered the opportunity to raid credit card balances. Then in complete contrast to the all Turkish fare the rally stopped off in Greece for two nights in Kastellorizo. Vangelis from the Athena restaurant welcomed the fleet to "Europe", where the fitter members scaled the escarpment behind the town and swam into the grotto that shone at its best electric blue while reflecting the cloudless sky. In fact nearly two weeks

of clear blue skies and temperatures in the mid to high 20's ensured perfect conditions for all the activities.



Paragliding from the mountain behind Kas saw five of the party land 50 metres from the berthed vachts after 30 minutes of exhilaration soaring with the birds.

One historical highlight was the visit to Kaya Koy above Cold Water Bay near Fethiye where the ruins of what was the Greek city of Levissi demonstrates the mindlessness of global interference in local lives.



The Greek citizens of Levissi were shipped to Greece in 1922 as part of a population exchange set up under an international treaty involving Turkey, Greece, Italy, Britain, France and the USA. Today the town lies empty and visitors ponder the impact of the exchange upon the villagers who knew nothing of the world they were evicted to and who did not even speak the Greek language.

The race series was won by Steve Bolton and his crew from the Mornington Yacht Club but winning was not the objective and the real result was a dead heat across all participants.

Normally 12.30pm to 5pm would cover the time that we would need you - you can do one Saturday season or every one. Come and try it & see if it appeals to you -bring a friend if you like!

You would run up to 5 starts and we raise and lower over 20 flags in the 25 minutes that it takes to get everyone under way. You would make sound signals and make sure that no one starts too early.

It is busy for about 30 minutes at the start and then you take the finish times at the end the end of the afternoon over about 40 minutes. Sometimes in the middle of that you start some classes for a second race. Out in most weather conditions - it's a nice and rewarding day out!
