Lycian Coast of Turkey Rally 2013

Having now fallen in love with a very special portion of Marmaris we embark on our Lycian journey with our first day a cruise to Ekincik. En-route we pass a bay we are told is military and not to be entered. More about that later.....

We have a perfect sail to Ekincik in 10 to 15 knots of breeze on a reach and enter the bay to moor successfully in My Marina using the 'lazy line' system we will come to know well. The water is clear and the temperature about 24. No-one can the resist that. After drying out on board and getting

to know a few of the people from the other five yachts we attend the welcome dinner at My Marina Restaurant complete with the floorshow of our after dinner fruit trolley. The lights dim and the seven tiered stack of candles is wheeled into the restaurant as the music plays. The fruit, like all the fruit, salad and vegetable here is delicious.

Next day is an optional excursion to Caunos, the Lycian tombs and lunch in Dalyan. Our guide and caique owner is Don. A wealth of information, as are all the guides we have ever encountered in Turkey. Don is an instant favourite. We visit the turtle feeding and learn about the efforts being made to protect the breeding beaches of the creature,

the history of Caunos and the remarkable tombs as we meander through the reeds of the river delta (African Queen style) and back again -after lunch in the modern town of Dalyan.

Most of the crews then decide to leave the marina to a nearby bay for night under the stars at anchor. Perfect!

As the sun rises on the next morning it's in for another swim before breakfast and the realisation that today is RACE day! We react slowly

> and paddle off after the morning 'sched' to meet another bay for more swimming and a light





lunch. As we approach the designated bay we hear what sounds like WW 111 starting. The bay we had passed on our first day spews out the navy ships to practice war games and it sounds very like the real thing. There have been warnings on VHF for the previous days so we crack a few jokes about Exorcet missiles and proceed to the rendezvous spot.

The bay is once again perfect temperature, perfect colour and just too good to be true! As Trevor predicts the breeze arrives around

1.00pm so we up anchor and amble out to the start line. The race is 15 miles to Sarsala and the conditions are once again unbelievable. What a day. And Sarsala!

Sarsala is a bay with pine trees to the water's edge, a quay with lazy lines, tables line the quay and the 'business' side of the establishment is hidden in the trees which climb up the steep hillside. From here we later sample the best goat casserole on the planet after the mezes and fresh village breads and followed by luscious fruits, strong Turkish tea or coffee. Is this haven going to be able to survive another ten years? We certainly hope so.

We wake in Sarsala bay and of course it is in for the morning swim, fresh water rinse off on the back of the yacht, breakfast, fresh baked village bread and how about we go to another bay for another swim. Mesut, our guide, technical support and local language speaker suggests just such a place. Thirty minutes later we are anchoring beside a sunken 'house or something' and the swim reveals just that.

Some of our party make for the town of Gocek for an evening of 'civilization', some head for yet another bay for the night and with so much to choose from it is easy to make the right decision. No matter what you chose to do here you could not go wrong.

And this is only day four of fourteen! It surely cannot get better than this!
