



## Yard Rules

September 16

Morningside Yacht Club (MYC) is directly adjacent to parks and foreshore areas used extensively by the public. It is therefore essential that we abide by the strict EPA regulations controlling air and water pollution. Members use the Yard facilities at their own risk. The Club shall not be held responsible for any loss, theft or damage to any vessel equipment or fittings.

1. All boats in the yard, other than tender dinghies, must have, as a minimum, Third Party and Public Liability insurance. Owner to lodge with the Club a Declaration of Insurance cover.
2. Members who utilise the slip and yard facilities must adhere to agreed schedules, *particularly the dates and times for Winter and Summer Storage Change over dates. Failure to adhere* to an agreed time will incur an additional storage charge.
3. Use of Yard equipment or Club boats is only available for use by members after permission has been obtained from the MYC Office or CEO or Duty Manager.
4. Boat owners must comply with all instructions by CEO or Duty Manager.
5. Contractors may be used to carry out work providing that:
  - They report to the MYC office or Duty Manager prior to commencing work and are inducted to MYC standards.
  - They carry appropriate insurance and work in accordance with Club OH&S and EPA legislation.
  - They are approved by the CEO or the Duty Manager.
  - They agree to comply with all instructions from the CEO or Duty Manager and obey all MYC Rules and Regulations.
6. Wet sanding and pressure washing of boats hulls is encouraged, but may only be carried out in the designated traverser pit area.
7. Residues from dry sanding, hull blasting, spraying etc. shall be completely contained in accordance with EPA regulations.
8. Club members and Contractors must at all times use Personal Protective Equipment and Clothing (PPE&C) appropriate to the work they are undertaking.
9. The Yard is to be kept clean and tidy; all rubbish to be cleaned up at the end of each day, hoses rolled up and equipment stored.
10. The Winch house workshop is out of bounds to all members, contractors and visitors. Tools are not to be removed from the Workshop without approval from CEO or Duty Manager.
11. Waste and recycling bins are provided for your convenience. Members and contractors are to remove all waste including oil and solvent residues from the site. A member will be charged for cost to the club for any waste or recycling materials left in the yard after maintenance works
12. Limited vehicle access is available at the discretion of the CEO and Duty Manager.
13. Children shall be supervised at all times

14. Only authorised and trained persons may operate yard equipment including the slipway winch , crane and yard tractor.
15. Members must be financial to have their vessel slipped.
